<u>Reading</u>

- 1. Where is the frozen wasteland located?
- 2. The character is looking for a man. What was he like to the character?
- 3. Do you think this is set in the present, past or future? Explain and justify your reasons for why
- 4. The character speaks to his professor. He says:
 "But Sir depending on temperature and pressure, solids can melt, liquids can melt and gases can liquefy."
 What do you think the word liquefy means? Explain your reasoning
- 5. How do you think the man feels when the professor asks him to assist him? Write 3 emotions and justify your reasoning using the video to help you.
- 6. Pause the video at 5:16. Make a prediction about what you think will happen next
- 7. What does the professor design to help him on his expedition?
- 8. Why do you think the man went to search for the professor? Give three different ideas and use the video to help justify your answer



<u>Writing</u>

- 1. Rewrite the opening scene, recounting the days the character spends in the artic.
- 2. Write a setting description of the artic, using a wide range of similes, metaphors and personification. Challenge can you include rhetorical questions? (Would I find him here in this icy wasteland?)
- 3. Compare and contrast the different scenes use in the film
- 4. Rewrite this as a diary entry from either the professor or the man. Remember to include the key parts of the films as well as different emotions they may feel.
- 5. Write a newspaper article about the disappearance of the professor.
- 6. Create a ship's log for the voyage to the artic. Predict how long this would take and then research to find out how close you were!
- 7. Think about a sequel and write that (what happens after this film?)
- 8. Write a character description of either the professor or the man
